B. Activity/program/strategy you will implement to address the promising approach(es):(brief description)

Foothill is starting a **new Active Citizenship and Leadership Academy**. The academy will combine the Leadership Class and Social Studies Classes. Both elected and nonelected students can be in the Leadership class/Academy; the result is expanding leadership to more than 130 students. The academy will be divided into three sections – Campus Community; State and Local Community and Global Community. Students will organize community involvement projects in each of these areas, and the projects will tie back to their learning in Gov. and Social Studies classes. (This will be service-learning, but the school doesn't call it this). Discussions of current events and simulations will be regularly used by teachers in both Leadership and the Academy's Social Studies classes.

C. What student civic competencies (knowledge, skills, dispositions) do you expect to impact?

The teachers who started this want to increase academy students' civic and political knowledge and skills. They are striving to develop leaders who believe that they can make a difference; feel that have a responsibility to do so; have experience participating; and understand the political historical context for doing so. They also see the academy having an impact on the larger student body; it's envisioned as a vehicle for involving students in community and political projects, as well as a catalyst for developing civic attitudes.

D. Where are you in the implementation of this component? (timeline)

Spring: The Academy has been approved by the school and will begin in 2005-06. The three teachers have signed on, and the students have been registered for it. The teachers made presentations to all social studies classes; and students applied in droves. The three teachers meet regularly to plan the curriculum. **2005-2006 School Year**: Start of the Academy
